Presidents Letter by Elaine Cousins



As I reflect back on the last year and look ahead to the next, I'm very pleased with the extent to which our Vladimir Canterbury Sister City Association is becoming a part of the fabric of life in Bloomington-Normal and the extent to which citizen diplomacy reaches so many. In August, I had the pleasure of speaking to a group of residents at Luther Oaks and while I was telling them about the visit of Russian Agriculturalists who visited us for a week in June, I learned just how impactful the visit was for a local family. One of our tour stops was at the soil testing lab in Cropsey. It was one of the highlights of the tour for the group which included several soil scientists. What I learned from the Luther Oaks resident was that the soil testing lab was owned by one of her relatives and their whole family has now engaged in email conversation with at least one of the delegates. It seems that the distance between Vladimir, Russia and Cropsey, Illinois has indeed become smaller as a result of our association's work. In September, I'll be speaking to a group of teachers at a Delta Kappa Gamma meeting and sharing with them the idea of a joint project for their students and students in Vladimir. Tatyana Semenova, a teacher and sister city member in Vladimir has suggested some interesting topics for collaboration among students. I hope the Bloomington-Normal teachers will be encouraged to follow through on the idea and we'll launch a new generation of young citizen diplomats. Some people have questioned whether we should have a sister city relationship with a Russian city when there are differences between our two countries. I always respond, as I'm sure you do too, that when tensions are higher, our sister city relationship is even more important. Information about next year's Open World programs should be available soon and we are eager to see if there is a topic that we can apply for. The Open World program is

funded by the US Congress and invites young professionals (under 30) to come to the United States, learn about our government, and have a home stay experience in a U.S. city with a professionally-oriented tour. In recent years we have hosted Open World groups in the areas of Agriculture, Special Education, Libraries, City Administration, and Law.

Our relationships with International programs at Illinois State University have grown even stronger in the past few years. In addition to the Kinesiology and Nursing exchanges in recent years, ISU is exploring expanding its programs with Vladimir State University with programs for Education and Agriculture students. President Dietz visited Vladimir State University last Spring with an ISU Kinesiology student group and visited Vladimir Medical College with an ISU nursing student group. He looks forward to more exchanges between ISU and these two universities.

Open World Agriculture Visitors

This past June, five agronomy faculty from Vladimir State University and a facilitator visited the twin cities for nine days. During the visit they stayed in local homes and some of you meet them at the potluck social held in their honor. They visited twenty-three agriculture sites in and around McLean County and learned about American agriculture. We learned that they do not use GMO in their food production and love garage sales. As a result of this visit, two faculty from the Department of Agriculture at ISU will be visiting Vladimir in spring 2017. We are excited for this future exchange and to see what develops.

Mennonite College of Nursing, Transcultural Nursing Student Exchange

Illinois State University Mennonite College of Nursing will host four visitors from Vladimir Medical College this fall 2016. Our translator, Nina Bedova, will bring with her one VMC faculty member and two nursing students. Our guests will arrive on Monday, October 3rd and will depart to go back to Vladimir on Monday, October 17th. Our visitors will stay in host homes that are currently being determined. We will arrange tours in the Mennonite College of Nursing Simulation Lab, tours of regional hospitals and clinics, provide nursing classes for them to participate in, as well as provide some cultural activities such as participating in the ISU Homecoming festivities. We look forward to welcoming them once again this year. It is always a pleasure and a great learning experience for everyone.

VCSCA Archives transferred to McLean County Museum of History

Since the beginning of the local search for a Soviet Union Sister City, the history of the Vladimir/Canterbury Sister City Association has been kept in large binders, now numbering nine. Additional archive material, such as Association minutes and newsletters, medical and educational exchanges, and Open World grants are also included in separate binders. The collection includes books, VHS tapes, DVDs, and posters relating to both Vladimir and Canterbury.

The Association Historian, Ann B. White, announced at the September 6, 2016 board meeting that all the archives, with the exception of the current volume nine, have been turned over to the McLean County Museum of History. This material will be available for those wanting to learn more about the Association and for research purposes.

Bill Kemp, the museum librarian, has requested the assistance of two volunteers to help catalogue this collection.

The concert will feature a fabulous program of Russian masterworks with guest conductor Vladimir Kulenovic. Featured on the program are works by Shostakovich, Tchaikovsky, and Rachmaninoff. After the concert there will be a reception in the BCPA ballroom with an opportunity to meet Maestro Kulenovic who is one of four candidates being considered for the position of music director for the Illinois Symphony. He is presently Music Director of the Lake Forest Symphony and was designated as "Chicagoan of the Year (2015) in Classical Music" by the Chicago Tribune. In addition, he is a staff conductor of the Lyric Opera of Chicago and the English National Opera as well as Resident Conductor of the Belgrade Philharmonic.

VI International Sports Forum
Vladimir Region,
October 10 – 13, 2016

Dr David Thomas and Dr Karen Dennis, faculty members in the School of Kinesiology & Recreation at Illinois State University and Board members of the Vladimir/Canterbury Sister Cities Association, have been invited to present at the VI International Sports Forum: Russia – Country of Sports. The conference will be held at Vladimir State University, Vladimir, Russia October 10-13. Dr. Thomas will give a plenary session presentation on the *Impact of Exercise and Sports on the Health of the American Population*, while Dr. Dennis will give a roundtable presentation on *Heart Rate Variability, Sport, and Health*.

The VI International Sports Forum “Russia – Country of Sports” is considered as the most representative sporting and business forum held in Russia. The Forum was established in 2009 by Degree of the President of the Russian Federation, Vladimir Putin, in order to determine priorities, key activities and development perspectives of the sports industry in Russia. The event is aimed to enhancement of competitiveness of Russian sports, creation of the effective sports industry and its integration into global sports community.

The Forum will gather around 3000 leading representatives from the sport movement and sports industry.
